Spectators Code of Conduct

- By entering the Bristol County Ground on Sunday 4 July for the One-Day International between England and Sri Lanka, you consent to participate in the study.
- All attendees aged 11 or over must show that you have received two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine (at least 14 days prior to attending the match) or that you have had a negative NHS lateral flow test for COVID-19 (to be taken within 24hrs prior to attending the match).

- Please be aware that Covid infection rates of Covid-19 in Bristol are rising sharply and are now well above the England average.
- You are responsible for your own health. You should assess personal risk relative to your own circumstances associated with attending the match before purchasing ticket(s) or attending the event.
- You should consider if you or one of your party or anyone in your household is in a vulnerable or higher risk group
- Attending the event should be assessed according to your own personal risk relative to your own circumstances.
- You should consider your travel arrangements carefully, taking appropriate measures to protect yourself and others
- If you are going to eat or drink out, or stay overnight, please abide by all Covid secure measures

- Please do not attend the ground if you have recently arrived from a country on the [Government Red list or Amber list](#) within the past 10 days
